



## Topic B: Political Unrest in Nepal

Nepal is going through a serious political crisis because of corruption problems and mistrust in the government, which led to protests directed by the youth. After violent demonstrations about censorship and corruption, Prime Minister Khagda Prasad Sharma Oli quit, and former Chief Justice Sushila Karki became the temporary leaders to maintain order and preparations for the March 2026 elections. Nepal has had political problems for many years, and no government has finished its full term since the monarchy ended in 2008. Many young people feel angry because of unemployment, inequality, and unfair politics. With elections coming soon, there are concerns about whether or not the voting will be fair and peaceful. The Security Council committee needs to act quickly to see how this situation might affect democracy, peace, and human rights in South Asia.
