# I. Face to Face Committee Sessions

At Olinca Model United Nations, we encourage delegates to follow certain rules of conduct. These rules include:

1. Attend all Committee sessions.
2. Always remain at the sessions, unless permission to leave is granted.
3. Stay in your assigned room. The location of each Committee will be posted.
4. Dress in formal/diplomatic attire, as established in the dress code (required for all Committee sessions). The use of inappropriate clothing can be detrimental for the delegate.
5. Always wear the Committee ID tag.
6. Take care of all the school facilities. Smoking is prohibited during the sessions and on all school premises.
7. Delegates cannot use electronic devices during debates. They are free to use the Resource Center that is available for all participants. Chairs will explain to their committees how the Resource Center is used.
8. Unauthorized outfits / costumes and fake weapons are not permitted.

## II. Debate Procedure

- Delegates must have a physical placard with their delegation's name on it, which they will raise should they want to participate.
- Voting for procedures will be done by raising the placard.
- Voting resolutions will be done through rollcall.
- If delegates need to communicate something to the Committee staff related to the debate, they must use the Protocol Points (Point of Order, Point of Personal Privilege, Point of Parliamentary Inquiry).

## III. Submitting Documents

- Delegates will be asked to hand in a printed copy of their country's position paper, which is intended to state their country's point of view. No plagiarism or misuse of AI is accepted. Copying your position paper will cause a direct warning. Delegates must turn in their Position Papers to their committee staff before the 1<sup>st</sup> session.

## IV. Dress Code

**Delegates are expected to wear business attire at all sessions. The following guidelines are provided to avoid confusion regarding the expectations:**

- Dress code: Business Professional or Business Formal.
- Business casual and casual clothing (T-shirts and sportwear) are unacceptable. Out of respect, it is not recommended to wear a country's costume.
- Revealing outfits are inappropriate for diplomatic work. Low-cut blouses or halters are not acceptable.
- Articles of clothing that reveal undergarments are inappropriate.
- Outfits intended to distract or disrupt the work of Committee sessions, such as costumes which include distracting props, are inappropriate. Fake weapons are not permitted.
- Hats and caps are not permitted in Committee sessions.
- The use of filming glasses (eg. Meta/Rayban) is prohibited in all school premises.

## V. Diplomatic Behavior

**During the sessions, delegates will present their nations' points of view regarding different topics to come up with a solution that suits all participating countries. Therefore, each delegate should respect these perspectives and act in accordance with the following rules of behavior:**

- Show respect to all delegates and participants including Members of the Secretariat, Members of the Committee, and Advisors/Faculties.
- Delegates must not insult, bother or mock any other delegate.
- Delegates must not use inappropriate language.
- Delegates must always refer to themselves and their fellow delegates in third person during the session.
- Inappropriate behavior between delegates may result in a warning.
